Officers for New Club to be Selected at Dinner Meeting Tonight

Officers for the newly organized Lions Club in Campbellsport will be elected at a dinner meeting tonight at the Northwestern Hotel. Larry Slater, Commissioner of Lions International, will preside at the meeting and will take charge of the election of officers. It is also expected that District Governor Lawson Lurvey of Fond du Lac, head of the Lions Clubs in Wisconsin, will be present with a delegation from the Fond du Lac Lions Club.

There are sixty-nine Lions Clubs in Wisconsin, and there are 2500 clubs in the Association which is the greatest service club organization in the United States. Neighboring Lions Clubs are located at Fond du Lac, Kewaskum, Milwaukee Port Washington, Plymouth, Hartford, Oshkosh, Sheboygan and many other towns throughout the state, there being more Lions Clubs in Wisconsin than in other service club.

It is believed by local businessmen that the formation of this club in our community is a forward step in business organization, and we may feel proud to be identified with a business organization which has such strength and prestige throughout America. Lions clubs are non-secret, non-sectarian, non-political clubs dedicated to a program of community service, and community building, through co-operation of representative men in the community. Meetings are held at least twice monthly, and all meetings are luncheon or supper meetings limited to never exceed one hour and fifteen minutes.

On charter night, about a month from now, Lions will be here from all neighboring Lions Clubs, and on that occasion Lions will invite the ladies as guests. It will be a gala affair marking the official installation of Campbellsport Lions, and on that date the District Governor will present the charter to the local club officially.
