

## Village of Campbellsport Postal Patrons

This is a reminder for those of you who receive their mail in one of the NDCBU's around the village (cluster boxes). It's that time of year again when we need to be vigilant in shoveling the snow from around those gray mail receptacles. For those of you who are in the new units on east and west Sheboygan St., Poplar St, south Jenny St., and east Main St, you probably are not aware of the policy of "No trail, No mail". The carrier must have a clear path from the street to the side of the unit where the mail gets deposited, if there is none, then the mail will not be delivered.

The patrons in each unit need to have an arrangement amongst themselves as to who is going to be responsible for clearing the snow away so that the carrier can safely deliver the mail. We usually will give you one day after a snowfall to clear the area, after that if it is hazardous for the carrier to reach the mail receptacle then we will not deliver the mail and it can be picked up at the post office. As you can see around the village, when the plows go through, depending on the amount of snow that has fallen, a pretty large snow-bank can build up. While our carriers want to deliver your mail every day, they are not going to jump the snow-banks in order to do so. Just as those in the rural areas have to keep the snow cleared away from their private mail receptacles, those in the village have to also follow suit in maintaining that the cluster boxes are also clear of snow. The safety of our carriers is a priority when it comes to delivering the mail.

Also, to avoid your locks freezing on your mail receptacle, it is a good idea to spray them with WD-40 in the fall before the winter weather sets in. You need to stick the nozzle in the area where the key goes in the lock.
